| | <p>Forest Hill House Tour Committee - Susan Winiecki reported the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tickets were available at Private Stock, Wild Orchid Antiques, and Forest Hill Antiques • All else was on schedule for the tour on April 22 |
| | <p>Communications Committee - Brent Tenefoss reported the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The deadline for submissions for the summer issue is June 8 • Color printing was investigated and determined to be cost-prohibitive • Bill Hand needed two additional delivery volunteers, and both slots were immediately filled by Phil Licking and Dave Brook |
| | <p>Social Committee - Grace LeRose reported the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They have finalized the entertainment lineup for Music In the Park, and it will be Cashmere Jungle Lords, the Gary Gerloff Band, the Brian Jones Project, and a bluegrass blowout • They are still considering an open mic talent show night • A volunteer is needed to coordinate the neighborhood plant swap • Phil Licking will attend the Westover Hills association meeting the next night to request a monetary contribution from them |

| | <p>Safety Committee - Luke McCall reported the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • He had received 22 requests to sign up for notification • More development is planned |
| | <p>Friends of Forest Hill Park - Monica Rumsey reported the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They needed 40 signatures on a petition to name the playground in honor of Joe Brooks • They needed letters of support from each area neighborhood association • Forest Hills' support was discussed, and while not all were in favor, the issue was then approved by majority vote • The lake plan update was presented at their last meeting • They have upgraded their website, and now have an entry on Wikipedia • There have been some security gate-breaching issues, and they are recommending the city install a camera and light • There will be an article in the 4/13/07 Richmond Times Dispatch about the Memorandum of Understanding |
| New/Other Business | <p>Phil Licking introduced Elizabeth Stevens, who was present to speak on concerns about Phydo Field, specifically that the users were concerned about the mulch; there was a need for more and for untreated mulch that the dogs won't eat. She stated that the users were willing to contribute both funds and labor. Luke McCall suggested getting the free mulch available from the city. Roger Clark advised that the church was considering several improvements, including a water source, expansion, as well as mulch.</p> |
