Park Improvement Committee (PIC)	Robley Jones provided an update of the May 22 Regatta planning and requested volunteer sign ups.
Social Committee	<p>Dorna Braswell reported that Farmers Market sales of pint glasses, flags, memberships, and yacht club stickers are going well. Volunteers are needed to man the swag booth at the market.</p> <p>Regatta posters have been printed and posted.</p> <p>The yard sale is June 5 and so far there have been ten sign ups.</p> <p>The first Music in the Park is Sunday featuring the VCU String Ensemble.</p>
Safety/Neighborhood Watch	Captain Gary Ladin and Officer Stacy Rogers reported that there had been parking complaints relating to the Saturday Farmers' Market. Also, thefts of copper pipes and gutters are occurring in the area. Crime concentrated in the St. Johns Woods Apartments was discussed and the officers recommended that neighbors send letters of concern to its management, the Mayor, and the Chief of Police.
Historic Designation	Carolyn Paulette reported that labeling and sleeving of 3,000 photographs was nearly complete and the vendor was proceeding with data entry. The committee produced and is selling calendars and notes cards and has raised \$700 in two weeks.
