Membership	Vicky Hamrick reported there are records for 252 households on the roster, however, a number are up for renewal (54 for the second half of the year, 50 that had not renewed in the first half of the year).

Park Improvement Committee	No report.
Social Committee	Dorna Braswell announced the December 8 social, to be held at the 43 rd Street Gallery. She reminded attendees that ideas/decisions are needed for additional fundraisers and the next year's events.
Safety/Neighborhood Watch	Lt. McQuail and Officer Stacy Rogers reported a 40% overall decline in crime since Officer Rogers started bike patrol. A recent robbery of an O'Toole's employee in the parking lot prompted the officers to remind citizens to stay aware and use a buddy system when leaving businesses late at night. Neighbors reported an increase in apparent prostitution at Reedy & 44 th ; Officer Rogers promised to investigate.
Historic Designation	Joy Glass reported that their sales of calendars and note cards grossed \$4000/netted \$3000 to date. The nomination application is being edited. They now expect to formally present the nomination in March 2011.
